To apply, students must follow the directions closely and complete the Town of Lenox Scholarship application in full. In addition, students are required to submit the Town of Lenox Scholarship essay and their college essay or a well-written writing sample. To be eligible for the James. F. Hurley Award students must be *seniors in high school* and submit an *additional essay* with their application. Essay prompts are found in the instructions. All materials must be submitted to the Guidance Office by Thursday, April 11, 2019. Please note, the Town of Lenox Scholarship application may also be used by community organizations for additional scholarship consideration.

TOWN OF LENOX SCHOLARSHIP ESSAY REQUIREMENT

Instructions:

- **Lenox residents who are seniors, Lenox residents who attend school elsewhere, including home-school and postgraduates:**

A thoughtful response to the question: Who or what has substantially influenced your life and your character? How has that influence shaped you, your interests or preferences perhaps? Your values? Describe and discuss, applying a specific situation as evidence of that influence. (600 word limit)

All essays should be double spaced using a 12 point font with one inch margins. Please proof read and check for spelling and grammar.

The following criteria will be used for scholarship award consideration:

- Academic performance, grade point average
- Quality of essay
- Community involvement
- Extracurricular activities
- Volunteer service
- Financial need

The Hurley Award

High school seniors only

The James F. Hurley Award recognizes individuals whose content of character is enhanced by their intellectual passion and remarkable personal promise. Applications are holistically reviewed and all students are encouraged to apply. As one would expect for any award named after the longtime chair of the LMMHS humanities department, this award requires a little more effort than the standard town scholarship. Award amounts may vary, but they can provide meaningful assistance for your educational costs.

To apply, you must be a *high school senior* and submit the following to be considered for this award:

- 1) Completed Town of Lenox Scholarship application form.
- 2) Town of Lenox Scholarship Essay: A thoughtful response to the question: Who or what has substantially influenced your life and your character? How has that influence shaped you, your interests or preferences perhaps? Your values? Describe and discuss, applying a specific situation as evidence of that influence. (600 word limit)
- 3) A copy of your college essay or a meaningful, well-written paper.
- 4) Answer *one* of the essay prompts listed below.

Candidates may be asked to interview with members of the scholarship committee at LMMHS.

Note: The Scholarship Committee is interested in understanding you as an individual. We will review your grades and your resume - all the factual stuff that makes up your candidacy; what is required now is a sense of who you are as a distinct person.

Thus, in no more than 600 words please respond to one of the following prompts:

1. Life presents challenges. Many we overcome, some we struggle with, some loom on the horizon. These challenges can take many forms. They may be incidental or they may be very substantial. Please address a challenge that you have confronted and discuss how you dealt-or deal- with it. Most importantly, what have you learned from that experience and what of value will you take with you in the future?
2. If you could hold a personal conversation or interview with any individual-living or not, even one who is fictional-who might that be? Explain why. They need not be famous nor spectacularly influential. They simply must be significant to you. What would be the circumstance for such a conversation: a setting, a situation, etc.? What questions would you ask? Why? What would you want them to know of yourself and what is important to you?
